ol. Alfred Merrill Worden was born and raised in Jackson, gradu-

ated from Jackson High School, before wandering off into the wild blue yonder. After obtaining his master of military science degrees in Astronautical/Aeronautical Engineering and Instrumentation Engineering he was one of 19 austronauts selected by NASA in April of 1966.

Worden served as a member of the astronaut support crew for Apollo 9, backup command module pilot for Apollo 12 and, finally, command module pilot for Apollo 15 in 1971. Apollo 15 was the fourth manned lunar landing mission and the first to visit and explore the moon's Hadley Rille and Apennene Mountains.



Now Worden will touch down in Jackson to present a book talk on his autobiography, *Falling to Earth*, which details his experiences in the space program and the wonders and challenges of flying to the moon. September 10: Lt. Francis Angier, B-17 Pilot. Angier was shot down over Hamburg Germany and later become a POW in Poland. He also talks of an eight day forced march in bitter winter weather ahead of the Russian Army. He was a POW at the same Stalag Luft #3 where the Great Escape took place a few months before he was interned there. Jackson WW II veteran Lt. Lee Zimmerman will answer questions about his experiences as a POW in Germany from 1944 to 1945.

October 1: Barney Cramton, USN. 50 Cal. machine gunner on a Grummen Avenger torpedo bomber aboard the USS Essex in the Pacific. This is the same type of plane that former President George H.W. Bush flew as the youngest Naval Aviator in WW II at that time. Mr. Cramton flew over 40 combat missions off of the Essex.
