The Rock Island Library will host *A Tribute to Children of the Holocaust* by artist and educator Barbara Powers, April 9 though June 8, in the Rock Island Main Library's 2nd floor art gallery. Powers will discuss the exhibit, and the experiences of the children it honors, at two public

events on **Tuesday, April**10:

Public art reception from 4:00 to 5:30 p.m.; and a

Book Talk, at 5:30 p.m., on The Promise: the Moving Story of a Family in the Holocaust, which Powers coauthored with Eva Schloss, stepdaughter of Otto Frank. The exhibit is dedicated to Schloss and her brother, Heinz, who did not

survive. Co-sponsored by the Jewish Federation of the Quad Cities and Rock Island Public Library Foundation, the exhibit is one of several remembrance events in the Quad Cities.
