

# Strengthening Community Connections—An Update

>A new immigrant recently moved to one of the WCLS branch communities. She had never been to her local library until she heard about "Talk Time." She now has a library card and visits regularly.

>A regular participant in another branch community's "Talk Time" became more confident in her English and as a result, has successfully transitioned to a computer class sponsored by Bellingham Technical College.

>In several branches, job search success stories have been reported. A number of patrons stop to thank staff for support in using library resources to fill out resumes and apply for jobs online.

Washington State Library's "Renew Washington" Library Services and Technology Act project was designed to address the needs of persons searching for employment related information, resources and services. During the second year of this work, WCLS continues to offer "Talk Time" which focuses on practice in English as a second language in collaboration with Whatcom Literacy Council. During the past several months there have been classes in basic computer skills in Spanish and English and family literacy nights.


