March is going to be a wonderful month!





Timber Hawkeye, the author of *Buddhist Boot Camp, is* back by popular demand. He will discuss the art of living and loving life like a puppy. Timber offers a secular approach to being at peace with the world, both within and around us, with the intention to awaken, enlighten, enrich and inspire.

Buddhist Boot Camp, which actually has little or nothing to do with Buddhism despite the title, is a collection of Timber's personal

journal entries and letters to friends over the course of a few years. The short stories offer mindfulness-enhancing techniques that we can all apply in our daily lives.

"The key," Timber says, "is not to necessarily learn anything new, but to un-learn a lot of the stuff we have picked up since childhood, and to enjoy life the same way that a two-year old does, or a puppy, experiencing the world with awe and amazement, not with judgment."

Timber is putting the final touches on his follow up book, an autobiography, which is scheduled to be published later this year.




