Get Online Tutoring from Brainfuse!

The Rock Island Library has just subscribed to **Brainfuse**, an online tutoring service. The free service supports the learning needs of Rock Island Library card holders in five ways:

HelpNow: Connect to live tutors,

access previous
sessions, use or
create
flashcards, work
on group
projects in the
collaboration area, and take
practice exams. For grades K12, with added resources for
college-age students. Subjects
cover math, reading, and
science.

HelpNow Writing Center: Submit letters and papers to receive

feedback on grammar, spelling, and punctuation.

Adult Learning Center: Receive resume assistance, find career resources and skill building exercises, and work on GED and Citizenship tests.

brainfuse ignite your mind

JobNow database: Resume and interviewing skills and assistance.

LearnNow: Take dozens of practice tests, like the ACT, SAT, GED, GRE, and ASVAB. Users can connect with a tutor to discuss a learning plan specific to the results from the practice tests.
